INTRODUCTION

The Payments Association of South Africa (PASA) hosted its 4th International Payments Conference (PIPC) on 27 to 29 September 2021. Previously held at the Sandton Convention Centre and being postponed in 2020 due to covid-related restrictions, the 2021 conference was hosted virtually.

Set over three mornings and 9 sessions, the conference explored the rapidly altering and transforming payments ecosystem, locally and globally. The plenary and multi-track sessions highlighted future challenges and opportunities in the world of payments, featuring 37 local and international thought leaders.

TECHNOLOGY ('VENUE')



The Hopin event platform was chosen to host PIPC2021 and provided a variety of functionality needed to make PIPC2021 an inclusive and multifaceted conference experience. This Included:






